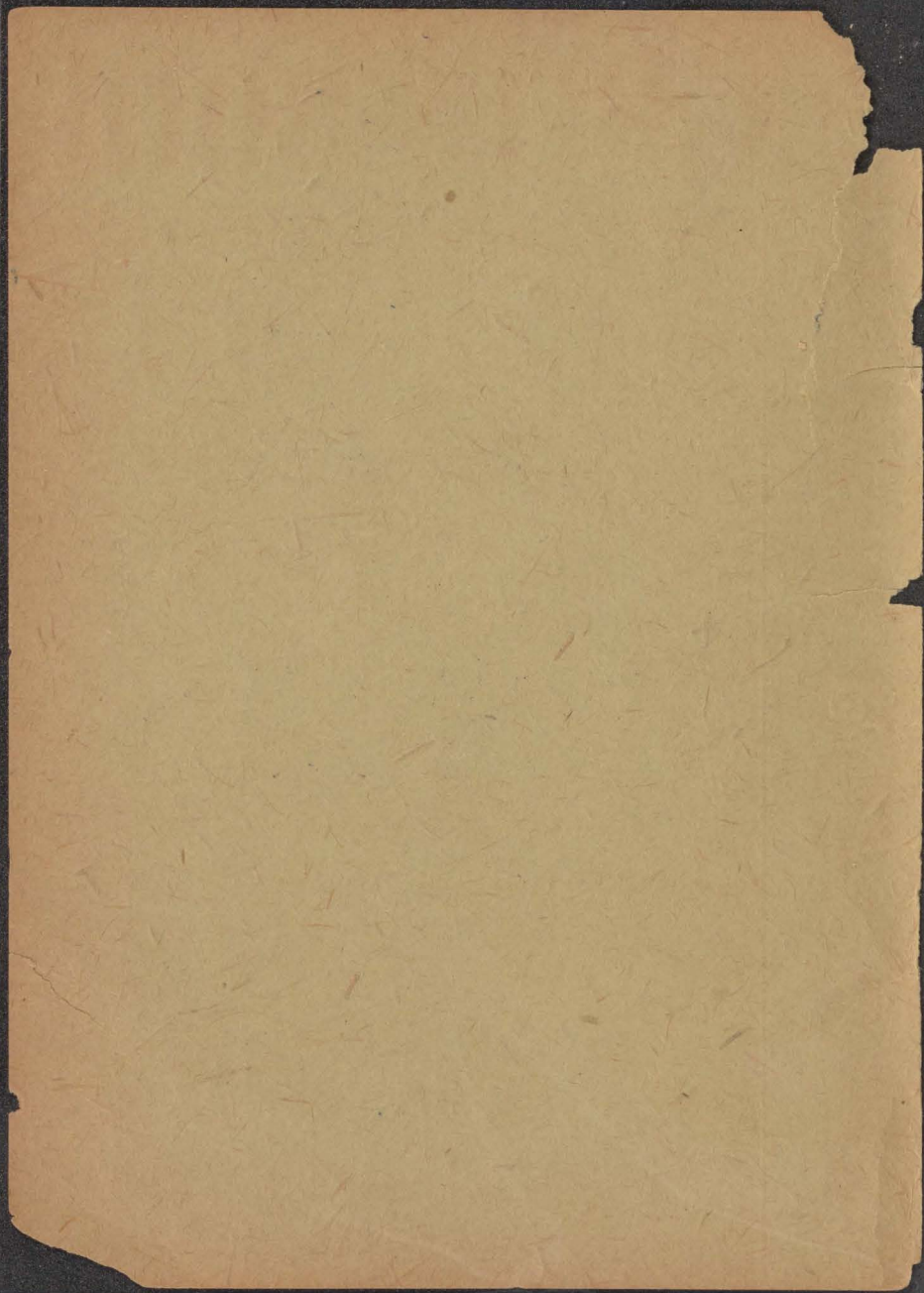

MONEY FOR NEGRO COLLEGES

This year more than ever we must see to it that our colleges are prepared to carry a maximum load of work, and ready to do it well. One group of colleges deserves special attention in this respect: the institutions that devote themselves to education of the Negro. Under the leadership of the United Negro College Fund thirty-three of these private colleges are beginning a campaign for \$1,300,000. John D. Rockefeller Jr. is chairman of the advisory committee for this third annual fund drive, and a number of other prominent men and women have interested themselves in the cause.

The need for full subscription is more pressing this year because of the unusual burden thrown on all educational facilities by the returning veteran. The Negro played an important and often heroic part in the war. He shared the mud, the dangers, the sweat and the tears. Now he has the right to continue his interrupted education if he wants to do so. Many college doors will be closed to him, and to others regardless of race, color or creed, simply because there are too many returning veterans to be cared for at once in the colleges of their choice. But we cannot allow these thirty-three Negro private colleges to turn away any applicant because they lack funds, or to curtail their programs because of it.

The educated Negro was once a rarity. His numbers are increasing year by year, and his contributions to the arts, science and education steadily gain a wider and juster recognition for his abilities. From these we all gain, regardless of color. And, as we mutually put a proper, unprejudiced estimate on the contributions of all races to the common good, we move surely closer to the goal of living together in harmony.

SAFE DRIVING RULES

1. Watch out for the driver who crosses the White Line.
2. When the other car passes you, watch out that he doesn't cut in on you.
3. Watch out for the driver who doesn't know any better than to pass on a hill.
4. Even when the light is Green, look out for the reckless driver coming from left or right, who is ignorant that the Red light is against him.
5. Watch the driver ahead — you can't be sure whether or not he'll signal when he turns.
6. Even on highways, look out for parked cars.
7. Watch the car coming down the steep hill towards you. Maybe the driver doesn't know enough to go into second.
8. Don't assume that the other fellow has good brakes.
9. At night look out for pedestrians walking on your side of the highway.
10. On Icy Roads look out! Some drivers don't know any better than to brake suddenly on ice.
11. Going over a hill, be ready for drivers who may be fool hardy as to make a turn across the road.
12. When you are passing, look out for the car that may be suddenly pulling out to pass just ahead of you.
13. Maybe the cop won't catch the car that passes you at 80, but "sudden death" is liable to.
14. On a three lane highway, watch out for the driver who thinks the middle lane is his exclusively.
15. Remember that Junior thinks that the ignition key is something to play with.

POINTS OF INTEREST IN NEW YORK CITY

THE EMPIRE STATE BUILDING is the tallest office building in the world and is situated at 5th Avenue between 33rd and 34th Streets. The site is nearly 2 acres and rises 102 stories above the ground and is 2 stories under the ground. It houses more than 25,000 tenants. Its elevators rise at the tremendous speed of 200 feet per second. While its express cars carry one to the 80th floor in one minute.

ELLIS ISLAND is the first landing place of the immigrant and is located in the upper bay of New York harbor. This island may be visited by securing a pass from the Commissioner of Immigration.

CATHEDRAL OF ST. JOHN THE DIVINE, located at Amsterdam Avenue, 110th to 113th Streets, is America's greatest church edifice. When completed it will be the largest Gothic Cathedral in the world. The seating capacity is 15,000 and room for 40,000 standing. It has been in the building for the last 61 years the corner stone being laid in 1892. Visitors are always welcome and services are held practically all day.

THE GEORGE WASHINGTON BRIDGE, over the Hudson River, is the longest suspension bridge in the East, connecting New York City at 179th Street and Fort Lee, N. J. It is used by millions of people annually, and is the Northern route to motorists going South from the North. Its towers, which stand 80 feet higher than the Washington Monument can be seen for miles around. The New York tower has the "Will Rogers Memorial Beacon," which serves as a guide to aviators.

THE THEATRICAL DISTRICT OF NEW YORK, where all of the largest and best plays are staged and produced, is located in the heart of the city. Here you will find the largest and best showhouses in the world from 39th to 52nd Streets and 8th to 6th Ave.

The colored show houses are located in Harlem: The Lafayette at 7th and 132nd Street; a W. P. A. house and the Apollo at 125th near 8th Avenue are the largest.

THE HOLLAND TUNNEL is the busiest vehicular tunnel in the world. Starts at Canal Street in New York and ends at 12th Street, Jersey City; N. J. This tunnel contains 2 tubes: one for West bound and the other for East bound traffic; each 2 tubes wide. The toll is 50c per car.

THE TRI-BOROUGH BRIDGE, which connects three of the boroughs of Greater New York (Manhattan, Bronx, Queens). This bridge is 17½ miles long and is the most direct route to the New York World's Fair. The toll charge is 25c.

CHINATOWN, at the Bowery and Chatham Square, is New York's Oriental section. Sight seeing busses will take visitors there from Times Square. Showing the Bloody Corner at Pell and Mott Streets which has been the place of countless murders caused by the rivalry of the Leong and Hip Sing Tong.

THE HAYDEN PLANETARIUM, which is located in the American Museum of Natural History at 81st Street and Central Park West can be seen "The Drama of the Skies." The most interesting feature of the Planetarium is the "Hall of the Sun," which shows the Solar System. There are six performances daily starting at 11 A. M. except Sunday and holidays. On these days the show starts at 10 A. M. The admission is 25c, 11 to 5 o'clock; evenings 8:30, 35c; 25c at 5 P. M. Saturday, Sunday and holidays. Children under 17 years of age 15c at all times. Reserved seats 50c and 60c.

ROCKEFELLER CENTER largest building project ever undertaken by private capital. Is situated between 5th and 6th Avenue at 48th and 51st Streets, and occupies 12 acres. The tallest building in the group is the R. C. A. Building and is 70 stories tall and houses the National Broadcasting Co. On the West of Rockefeller Center is the Radio City Music Hall R. K. O. Building R. C. A. Building west and the Center Theatre, also Radio City which is named in honor of the Radio Corporation of America. On the Fifth Avenue side will be found the Le Maison Francaise, British Empire Building, Italian Building and the six story extension of the International Building.

POINTS OF INTEREST IN NEW YORK CITY

CITY HALL at Broadway, Park Row and Chambers Street. It is the seat of government of the great metropolis and can be visited by the public from 10 o'clock A. M. to 4 P. M. daily.

CENTRAL PARK, which is the largest park in the city is located at 5th Avenue and Central Park West, 59th to 110th Streets. It contains 862 acres of which is water. It is $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles long and half a mile wide. It contains a Zoological Park and many play grounds.

THE GENERAL POST OFFICE is the largest post office in the world. It covers 2 city blocks from 31st Street to 33rd and from 8th to 9th Avenue. It houses 18,000 employees, makes 26 collections and 3 to 4 deliveries a day.

COOPER UNION-MUSEUM FOR THE ARTS OF DECORATION, Cooper Square at 7th St., Open daily except Sundays, 10-5., evenings, Oct. 1- 6:30- 9:30 Except Saturdays and Sundays. Free.

CLOISTERS, The Branch of Metropolitan Museum of Art, Fort Tyrone Park. Hrs: 10-5., Sundays 1-6., Closed Christmas Morning. Free except Mon. and Fri. 25c. Hrs. 8 to dusk; Sundays and Holidays 10 to dusk; Library closed on Sat., July

NEW YORK ZOOLOGICAL PARK, Bronx Park—Hrs. 10 to dusk every day. Free except Mondays and Thursday Adults 25c, Children 15c.

NEW YORK BOTANICAL GARDEN, East of 200th St., and Webster Avenue. Hrs. March 1 to November 1, 10 to 5; November to March 1, 10 to 4:30.

NEW YORK MUSEUM OF SCIENCE AND INDUSTRY, R. C. A. Bldg., Rockefeller Center. Hrs: 10 to 10 every day. Adults 25c., Children 10c.

AMERICAN MUSEUM OF NATURAL HISTORY, Central Park West at 79th St. Hrs: 9 to 5; Sunday 1 to 5. Free

AMERICAN GEOGRAPHICAL SOCIETY, Broadway at 156th St. Hrs: 9 to 4:45 Closed Sundays and Holidays; and on Saturdays during the summer.

MUSEUM OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK, Fifth Avenue at 104th St. Hrs: 10-5, Sundays 1-5. Closed Tuesdays. Free except Mondays 25c.

MUSEUM OF THE NUMISMATIC SOCIETY, Broadway between 155th- 156th Sts. Hrs: 2-5 Daily and Sundays. Closed July 16 to Sept. 1, Free.

MUSEUM OF THE AMERICAN INDIAN, Heye Foundation, Broadway at 155th St. Hrs. 2-5. Closed Sundays, Holidays and through July and August.

HAMILTON GRANGE, 287 Convent Avenue. Hrs: 10-5; Saturdays 10-1. Closed Sundays and Holidays. Free

WHITNEY MUSEUM OF AMERICAN ART, 10 West 8th St. Hrs. Tuesday to Friday, 1-5; Saturday and Sunday 2-6. Closed Mondays and Midsummer Months. Reopens about September 15. Free

PIERPONT MORGAN LIBRARY, 33 East 26th St. Hrs: Main Bldg., Tues. and Thursdays, 11-4; Exhibition Room, Daily 10-5. Closed Sundays, Holidays and July 1 to Sept. 7. Free.

MUSEUM OF LIVING ART, Fifth Avenue at 82nd St. Hrs.-10-5, Sundays 1-6., Closed Christmas Morning. Free except Mondays and Fridays. 25c.

FRICK COLLECTION, 1 East 70th St. Hrs., Sundays and Holidays 1-5. Closed Mondays, Decoration Day, July 4th, Month of August and Christmas. Free.

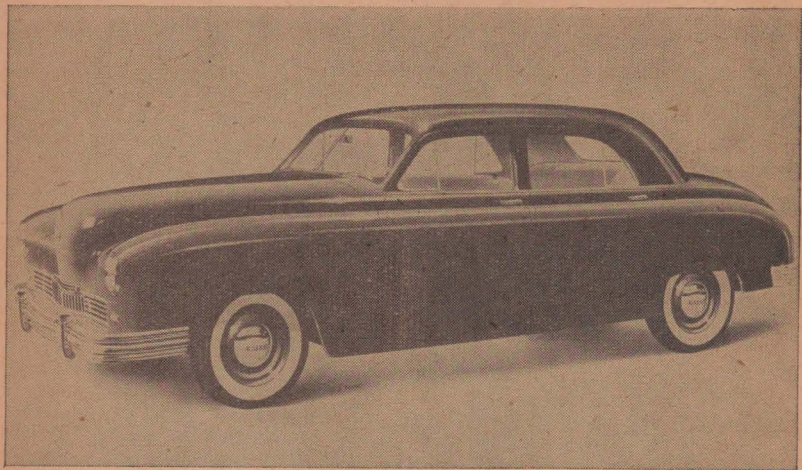
CONEY ISLAND, New York's own seaside recreation resort is ten miles from New York City. Here one will find bathing and all sorts of open air amusements.

BROOKLYN MUSEUM, Eastern Parkway and Washington Avenue, Brooklyn. Hrs: 10-5., Sundays 2-6., Free except Mon. and Fri. Adults 25c Children 10c.

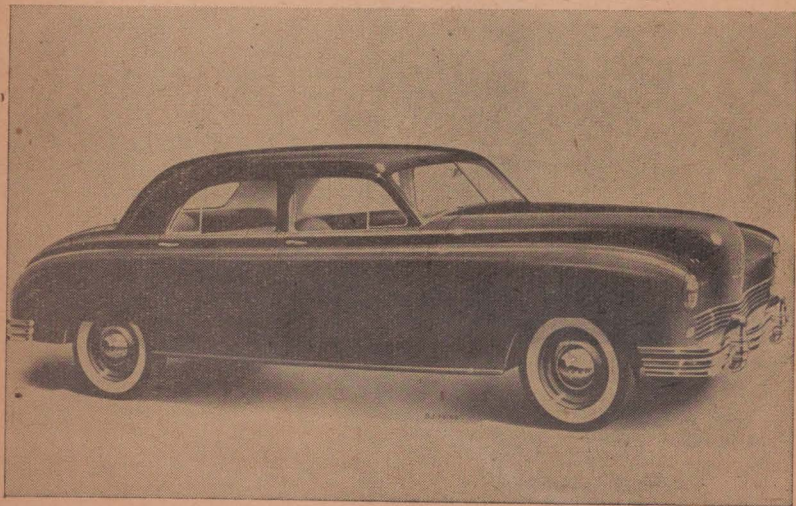

MAJOR ENGINEERING ADVANCES FEATURED IN NEW KAISER CAR

Front Wheel Drive, Torsionetic Suspension, and Monocoque Body Among Highlights

WILLOW RUN, Mich.,—Kaiser-Frazer Corporation's entry in the automobile industry—the Kaiser, named for Henry J. Kaiser—combines a greater number of design and major engineering developments than any new automobile in production history, it was revealed today.

In his first announcement disclosing details of the new car, Mr. Kaiser, chairman of Kaiser-Frazer Corporation and West Coast industrialists, said that the car will be a full-sized, six-passenger automobile with sleek new body lines and the following outstanding features:

1. It will be the first American car in the low-priced field to have front wheel drive. The six-cylinder 85-horsepower engine together with the clutch, transmission, and final drive assembly form a single "packaged power unit" forward in a manner which makes it possible for the engine, transmission and differential to be lifted clear for easy service.

2. Unlike other types of front wheel drive made in the U. S., the Kaiser engine is placed forward of the front driving axle thus maintaining a more constant center of gravity and resulting in better traction on hills and under all driving conditions.

3. The Kaiser is the first mass production passenger car in America to have independent "torsionetic suspension" on all four wheels. Twisting action of heat-treated steel bars gives new smoothness of ride at all passenger loads. Hydraulic shock absorbers complete this unique assembly.

4. Body and chassis form a single unit of the type known as "monocoque construction, eliminating strain, shifting between body and frame, and body squeaks.

"Throughout the past four years," Mr. Kaiser said, "every engineering principle now embodied in the Kaiser automobile was submitted to rigid tests and now we have completed the whole by adding the most beautifully designed body in the industry.

"Our engineers on the West Coast and engineers of Kaiser-Frazer Corporation at Willow Run concentrated on the goal of providing the American people with the finest, roomiest and most progressive automobile in the history of low-cost transportation. I believe we have now achieved this goal in an automobile to which I am proud to give my name."

The Kaiser car will be shown to the public at premier showings. At the same time the Frazer, named for

Joseph W. Frazer, president of Kaiser-Frazer and Graham-Paige Motors, will be unveiled as a new entry in the medium-priced auto field.

The new Kaiser was designed by Howard A. Darrin, internationally known stylist. Its body lines are characterized by a single sweep from front to rear fenders, the lowest silhouette in the industry, a wheelbase of 117 inches and unusually wide front and rear seats.

The engine is new and was developed by Continental Motors and Kaiser-Frazer engineers. The forward drive also eliminates the tunnel obstruction on the floors inside most other cars.

Other features of the new Kaiser car include: new-type, trigger-action outside door handles; concealed, push-button inside door controls; wide-base wheel rims for longer tire life; pressure-chamber ventilating systems eliminating drafts; chrome, plastic and lucite interior knobs and escutcheons; new-type, equalized and self-centering four-wheel brakes; large rear window contoured to the curve of the body in all directions; two-tone broadcloth upholstery; large luggage compartment and recessed license plate space; and concealed hinges on all doors.

THE NEW FRAZER CAR

ADVANCED BODY LINES FEATURE OF NEW FRAZER

First 1946 Automobile Has Very Low Silhouette, Extremely Wide Seats and Beautiful Styling Qualities.

WILLOW RUN, Mich.—The new medium-priced Frazer, which will be unveiled to the public in January, features advanced body lines, increased visibility, a new 100-horsepower engine and the widest seating capacity of any car in its price class, it was revealed today.

Named for the Graham-Paige Motors president, Joseph W. Frazer, and decorated with his family crest, the Frazer is a full-size, six passenger automobile designed by Howard A. Darrin, internationally-known automobile stylist.

The body of the new Frazer utilizes the extreme width of the car, the fenders becoming an integrated part of the body. Unprecedented seating width will accommodate four persons in the rear seat.

Other features adding to passenger comfort are the placing of the rear seat forward of the rear axle for smoother riding, elimination of the rear floor tunnel, and increased headroom.

The car provides exceptional vision. Pillar posts are moved back to provide greater front and side visibility and the contoured rear windows is unusually large.

With an overall height of only 64½ inches, one of the lowest cars in the industry, the Frazer yet provides normal road clearance. The car is powered by a full-usable 100-horsepower engine designed by engineers of Continental Motors and Graham-Paige. Despite the exceptional power, there is excellent fuel economy.

The interior is beautifully styled and the outstanding appointments are of chrome, plastics and lucite. Outside door handles, firmly attached at both ends so there are no clothing-catching protrusions, are operated by "trigger-action" when compressed with the fingers. Inside door controls, recessed and concealed, are of the push-button type.

Other features include exceptionally wide wheel rims, providing great stability and longer tire life, independent front-wheel suspension, forced draft ventilation, and an instrument panel of unusual design.

THE STUDEBAKER CAR

SOUTH BEND, Ind.—Fresh new styling, improved riding qualities and luxury appointments mark the new automobile models revealed today by The Studebaker Corporation.

Four body types in the popular, economical Champion series, Studebaker's offering in the low price field, will be manufactured in 1945. Production schedules promise a complete sampling of dealers within the next month.

The first passenger cars to be built by Studebaker since plant facilities were converted to war manufacture carry more numerous advances than the four-year blackout of research on civilian products would indicate.

New styling introduces the "Skyway" motif in a wide variety of colors to the lowest price field. Pioneered by Studebaker in its higher priced models, the design reduces body lines to their simplest essentials. Hood, fenders and tonneau are impressively "clean." A bright, new grille, with strong horizontal members extending virtually full-width across radiator and fenders, complements the graceful lines of the car. Rugged bumpers with vertical guards further enhance an appearance of roadability.

Both in exteriors and interiors the new models include features that in

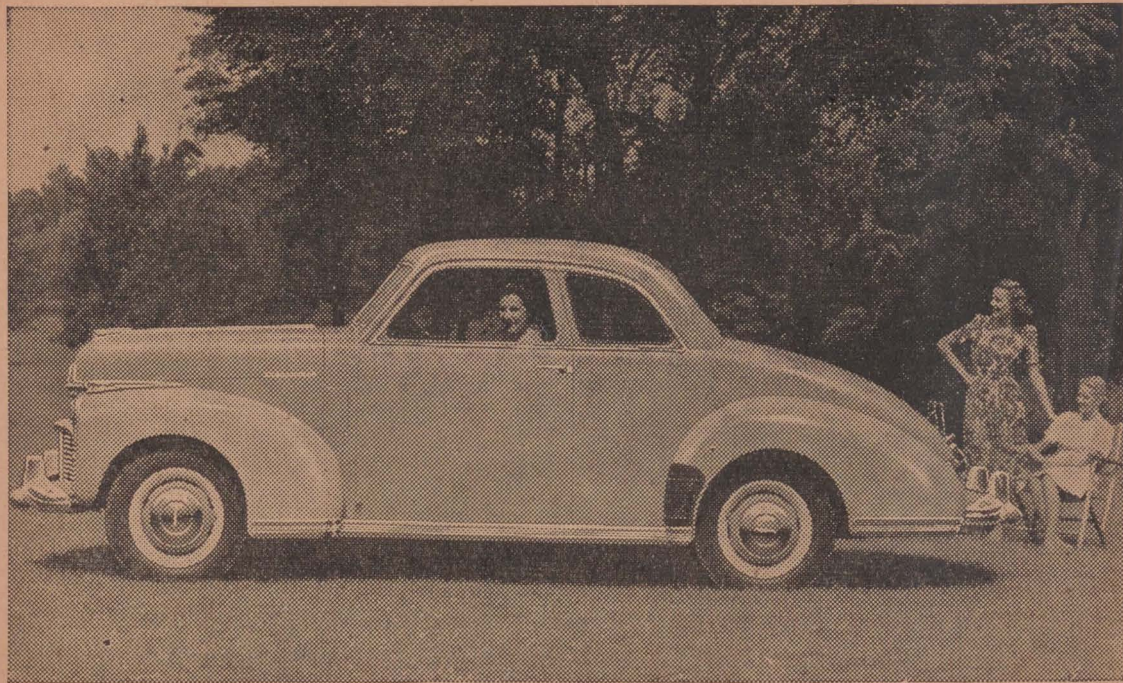
prewar days fell into the category of luxury appointments. Now standard are such specifications as de luxe steering wheels; automatic dome lights in all models; automatic rear compartment lights in four-door sedans; and bright metal for body sill finishing strips, windshields and rear and side window moldings. Twin airtone horns, dual sun visors and windshields wipers, and arm rests on both front doors—details that add much to the pleasure, convenience and safety of motoring—are other features. Interiors are made additionally notable by the use of a rich wool Bedford cord as the upholstery cloth.

The Champion six-cylinder engine, that as the power unit for the war-famous Weasel met successfully perhaps the most rigorous test ever assigned to a passenger car engine, is continued substantially unchanged. Worthy of comment among engine changes is the return of aluminum alloy pistons which were discarded in 1941 due to the scarcity of aluminum as a war material. The substitution of aluminum for cast iron reduces piston weight by more than half and guarantees longer bearing life.

Chief among chassis advances are the newly designed springs. Spring action has been improved by tapering the ends of the leaves and the intro-

duction at both front and rear of oil-impregnated, full-length inserts known as Flex-o-liners. These Studebaker-designed inserts to tend reduce inter-leaf friction and to assure smooth, soft spring action for many more miles of car life. Combined with the stability of planar front springing, the development imparts a new ease to riding. Shot peening, a method of toughening outer metal surfaces—which Studebaker brought to new standards of precision in the manufacture of the Flying Fortress engine—has been continued for all of the spring leaves.

Automatic choke, floto oil screen, large capacity air cleaner and foot-regulated hydraulic brakes are other chassis high spots. A 15-plate battery

replaces the previous 13-plate. Transmissions contain helical, silent gears throughout. Again Studebaker reports more pay-load tire capacity than on any of the other leading low-priced automobiles, another factor in economical operation. Tire sizes are 16x5.50.

Rotary door latches, by which doors close snugly without slamming, continue as a feature of Champion bodies.

Overdrives, assuring greater smoothness and more gas mileage at higher speeds, hill-holders, and the Climatizer, which gives forced air circulation for both winter and summer driving, are among the accessories available at extra cost.

DETROIT, Mich.—With new 1946 Hudson automobiles already coming off the production line, and the new models to be distributed to the expanded distributor-dealer organization as rapidly as possible, the Hudson Motor Car Company is prepared for a capacity output as rapidly as materials are available.

Pointing out that Hudson has produced as many as 300,000 cars in a year, A. E. Barit, president and General Manager, said that immediate plans call for utilizing all plant facil-

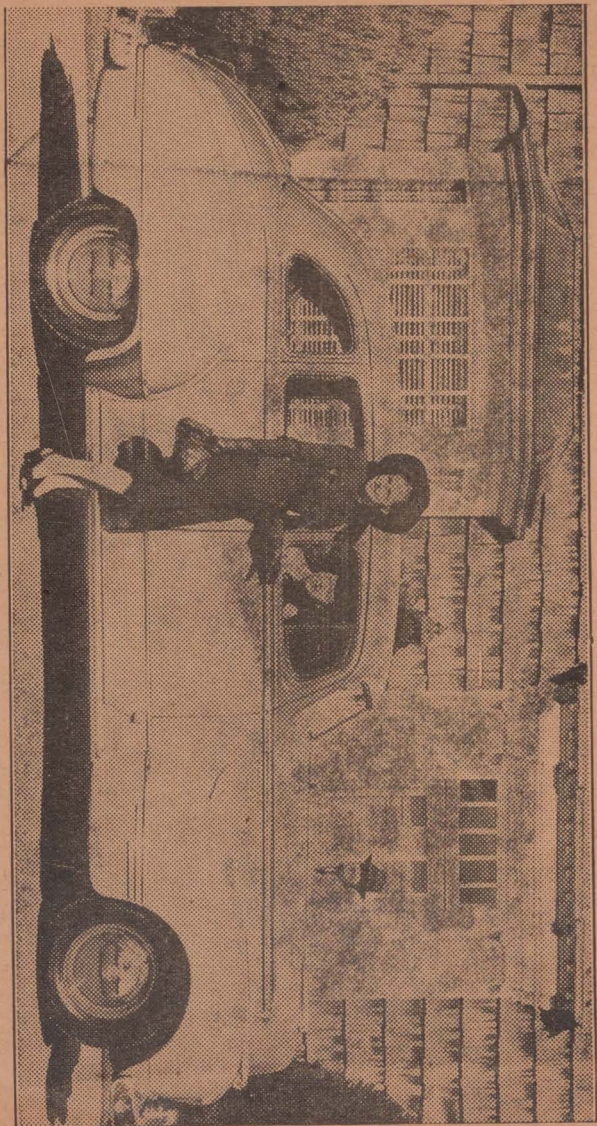
ities to meet current and future demands for automobiles.

"Hudson's 1946 models bring many improvements and refinements to the postwar market," said George H. Pratt, General Sales Manager, "including an entirely new front end, new exterior styling and completely new interior, embodying luxury, comfort and convenience."

At the same time, major features which enjoyed wide popularity in the 1942 models have been retained—

among them the famous Super-Six and Super-Eight motors; Drive-Master; which does away with clutch and gear lever operation in forward driving; and Patented Double-Safe Hydraulic Brakes, which provide an emergency mechanical braking system operating automatically from the same foot pedal.

Here are some of the highlights of production and distribution plans as announced by the Hudson management:

The 1946 cars will be produced on one wheelbase—121 inches.

Two distinctly different "style" lines will be built—a Super Series and a Commodore Series.

Each of these series, however, will be available in both Sixes and Eights—corresponding body models of the same series being identical except for power plant and price.

Production will start with six-cylinder models only—Eights following as soon as reconversion of eight-cylinder motor machinery can be completed.

Scheduled for first delivery are 4-door sedans, to be followed by broughams and club coupes.

Later, as the most urgent demand is met, 3-passenger coupes and convertibles will be added to the line.

In addition to passenger models, Hudson will start immediate production of cab pick-ups, as part of a program to meet urgent requirements for commercial vehicles of $\frac{3}{4}$ -ton size.

Some idea of the scope of Hudson's manufacturing and distribution plans is given by the fact that the company recently entered the market for additional materials totaling 40 million dollars in value.

In announcing its production program officials of Hudson stated that the company was in an extremely favorable change-over position because of facilities for building virtually a complete car in its own plants.

These facilities include Hudson's large and modern body plant—a fact that eliminates the possibility of a bottleneck in body production.

COMPLETELY NEW FRONT END

Chief appearance change in the 1946 Hudsons is an entirely new front end design, the over-all features of which are shared by both the Super and Commodore Series.

Here, Hudson designers have worked with studied care to create a more massive appearance, with lines that make the entire car look lower from a head-on angle.

In the center, at head-lamp level, is a newly designed adaptation of the Hudson Triangle emblem, mounted on a heavy cross bar which tops the grill, and indirectly lighted from the rear. The grill itself is much heavier than in previous designs, and is cast instead of stamped.

Bumpers are heavy, wide and very long, with bumper guards of tubular construction—much deeper and more attractive.

Sealed-beam head-lamps are of oval design, each carrying the Hudson emblem at the bottom.

On Commodore models, bumpers are longer and extend around the side, affording greater strength and additional fender protection. Extra guards are set near the ends of the front bumper on these models.

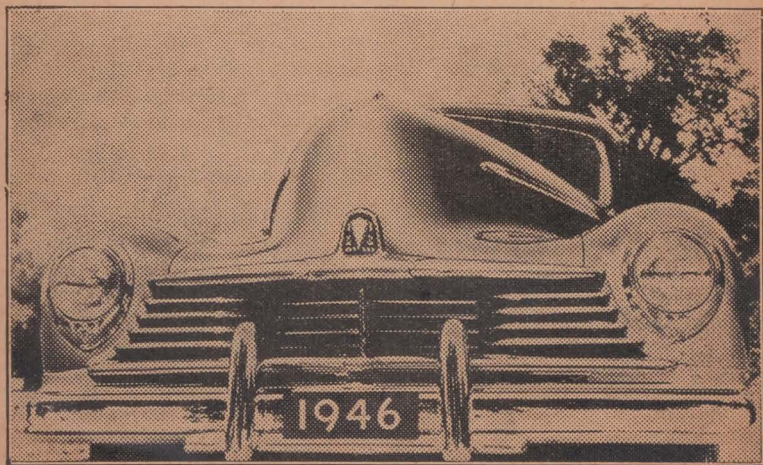
The plastic bonnet ornament on all models is of entirely new design, and is set well back, heightening the appearance of fine custom designing. Streamlining on all models has been greatly improved by new belt mouldings of bright metal, which run the length of the car and curve gracefully down at the rear.

This feature is particularly well adapted to two-tone painting, which has been reversed in 1946 models, with the dark color above and the light color below.

Commodore models for 1946 carry an auxiliary belt moulding which extends the entire length of the body, with plastic Hudson Triangle emblems at the front. All models carry series identification on the bonnet, below the moulding.

Wide, full-length running boards are continued for 1946, but they are concealed by the flare at the bottom of the doors, adding to smart appearance and affording protection from ice and snow.

Another popular safety feature—the front-hinged hood which locks from the driver's compartment is continued for the coming year, with the battery conveniently mounted under the hood.

Again, Hudson leads in sedan and brougham luggage space, with a 25-cubic-foot rear compartment with the spare tire mounted upright on the side, where it can be removed without disturbing an ordinary load of luggage.

NEW LUXURY INTERIORS

Interiors have been completely restyled in all 1946 Hudsons, and here there are important differences in treatment in the Super and Commodore series.

Rich, durable upholstery fabrics are used in all models. They are of neutral tone—a fine shadow weave in the Super series and Bedford cord in Commodores.

Airfoam seat cushions, introduced to the industry by Hudson, are standard in Commodore models and an extra-cost option in the Super series.

Leather is generously used in the upholstery plan of all 1946 Hudsons—and particularly in the Commodore series, in which not only arm rests, seat backs and door panels are leather trimmed, but seat cradles are leather covered and seat cushions are edged with broad bands of handsome grained leather.

Grained instrument panels bring new design touches in all models, with easy-to-read instruments against a

silver background in the Super series and a gold background in the Commodore series.

Instruments include the highly successful push-button starter, and automatic teleflash dials for oil pressure and generator.

Commodore models have a steering wheel of plastic, 18 inches in diameter; in the Super series the wheel is of 17-inch diameter, grained to match the instrument panel. Hardware, both exterior and interior, is of new streamlined design.

Both the Super and the Commodore series are offered in six or eight-cylinder models—a fact which permits buyers to combine the power plant of their choice with the type of appointments and equipment they prefer.

Both engines are equipped with dual carburetion, for top performance and economy. These are the latest refinements of the famous motors that have carried Hudson to more than 120 official stock car records for performance and endurance. They give owners a choice of 102 horsepower in Sixes and 128 horsepower in Eights.

Hudson Drive-Master is available with either six or eight-cylinder models. This popular feature, proved through the difficult conditions of war years, enables drivers to go through the full forward range of speeds without the use of either clutch pedal or gearshift lever.

Drive-Master is mechanically simple, and light. It eliminates "creep"

at stop-lights, and Hudson engineers claim for it proven advantages of fast acceleration, smooth operation and economy.

Hudson Weather-Master will also be available in early production, as a low-cost option. This combination heating and ventilating unit scoops in fresh outdoor air through a rain-proof cowl ventilator, heats it to a controlled temperature in winter, and distributes it through the car.

Hudson's Weather-Master, combined with built-in defrosting vents, frees the car interior of smoke and stale air, and keeps the windshield and windows free of fog, frost, snow and ice.

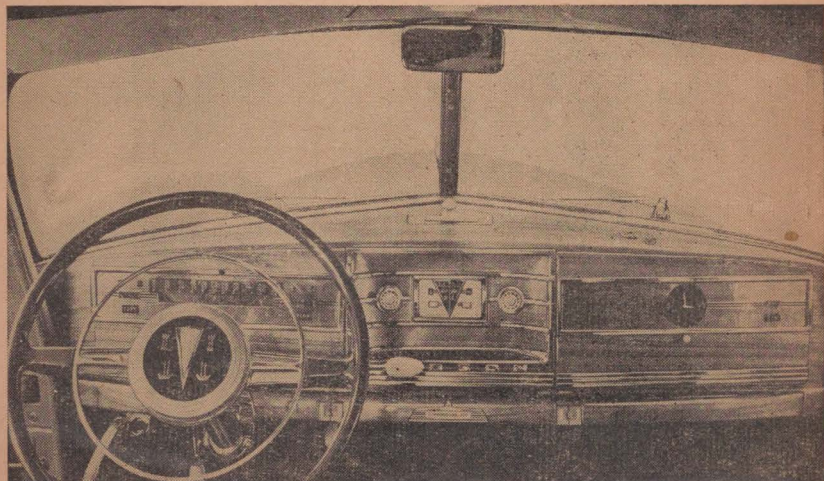
More news for motorists comes in Hudson's announcement that greatly improved Zenith radios will be avail-

able in all models, offering a new safety and convenience factor in that both station selection and volume are controlled by a foot button.

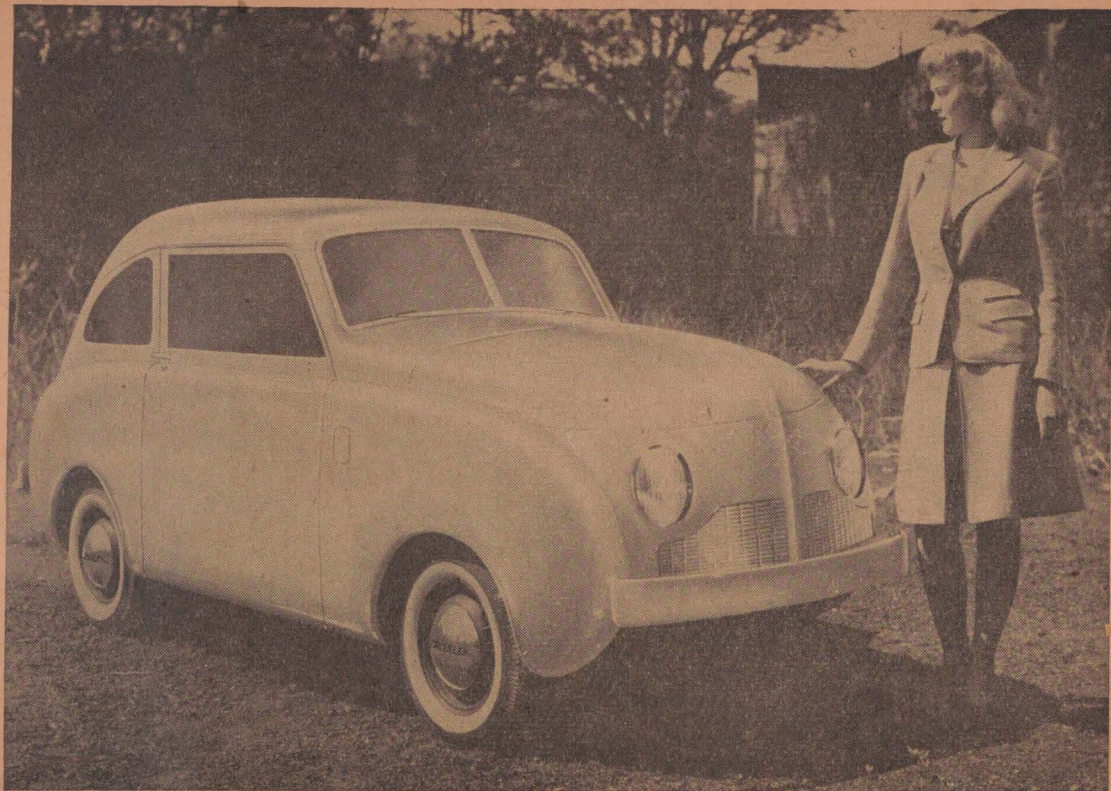
The 1946 Hudson's, regardless of body style, will be offered in a range of nine standard body colors, with two special cost colors and three two-tone combinations at extra cost.

In addition to its Super and Commodore series of passenger cars, Hudson will put into early production a $\frac{3}{4}$ -ton cab pick-up sharing the major features of the regular Hudson line. It will be powered by the Super-Six engine and will offer many improvements of interest to commercial buyers, including larger tires, larger brakes and heavier springs. This model will be offered in a choice of three body colors.

Powell Crosley Jr., president of Crosley Motors, Inc. revealed that his new highpower, light-weight, low-cost automobile shortly to appear on the road, will be streamlined in the modern style.

A new automobile engine hardly bigger or heavier than a standard typewriter, yet powerful enough to give 60 miles per hour and 50 miles to the gallon of ordinary gasoline at 35 miles per hour. The new Crosley car is destined to make automobile history in the low cost transportation field.

It will weight only 59 pounds, but produces $26\frac{1}{2}$ horsepower, which is ample to give to the proposed new Crosley car performance equal to that of much larger cars. The new engine is built on a radically new principle from thin sheet stampings instead of heavy forgings and castings. The cylinder walls are of chromnolybdenum steel and are only one sixteenth of an inch thick. The engine parts are all stamped from thin metal and tubes crimped together, then brazed into a single piece by melting pure copper into all the joints by an hour's baking in a hydrogen or gas furnace. The entire engine is thus precision formed, machined to exact dimensions and is ready to go to work. The $26\frac{1}{2}$ horsepower, four cylinder, water cooled, high speed engine has passed the rigid tests of the Navy and is being produced at Cin-

cinnati. The process for making an engine out of brazed stampings though new for the automobile is a wartime developement and has proved its value in service.

Design figures on the new engine shows that it is as revolutionary as its simple construction. It operates at the high speed of over 5000 revolutions per minute. Its four cylinders are only $2\frac{1}{2}$ inches in diameter with a $2\frac{1}{4}$ inch stroke. The pistons are cast aluminum alloy and the crank case is an aluminum casting. The cooling system holds only 5 quarts of water, but the pump forces 12 gallons of water through the system per minute.

The low fuel consumption of the new engine is a direct result of the thin engine walls. They permit efficient cooling of the cylinders, with no hot spots possible. This in turn permits the use of the high compression ratio of 7.5 to 1, even with regular gasoline.

A gallon of regular gasoline will drive the car for 50 miles at a speed of 35 miles per hour. Even at 55 miles per hour and faster the fuel consumption is only a gallon for 36 miles.

"This new engine will restore to America its chief pride and joy; Low cost transportation," said Mr. Crosley. In the past 15 or 20 years public in-sistance on speed, comfort and performance has lifted automobile quality way up but has also lifted the price

above the thousand dollar mark. It is high time for a complete new approach to the automobile problem and that we now have. But performance comes before cost. The new engine has twice the horsepower for the same weight. It will enable us to put out a car weighing only one third of the weight of a standard car and as economical to run as the pre-war Crosley but as eye pleasing and smooth running as any of the standard heavy cars.

The new two door Crosley characterized "a fine car" and capable of every service performed by the conventionally sized pleasure car, yet more easily maneuvered and parked. The car is 145 inches from bumper to bumper, has an 80 inch wheelbase and a 40 inch tread. Its overall height is 57 inches and its overall width is 49 inches. It has two seats in front, two in back and a luggage space 25 by 40 inches. The spare tire (4½ by 12) is carried beneath the storage compartment; gear shift is standard, three speeds forward and reverse. The lighting equipment consists of two standard head-lights with high and low beams, standard tail lights for parking. The car has a six gallon gasoline tank. It requires only 3 quarts of oil and five quarts of water or anti-freeze mixture. The body of the Crosley car was styled by Sundburg and Ferar, industrial designers, Detroit.

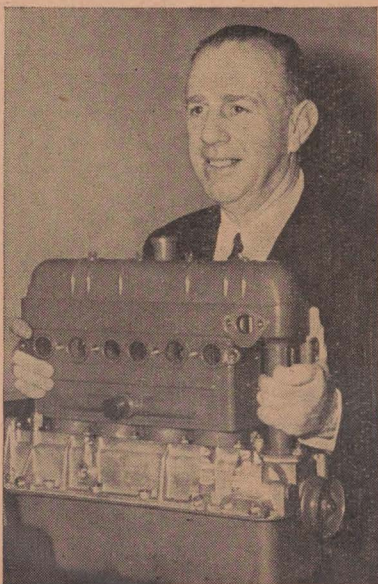
The engines will be manufactured at the plant of Crosley Motors, Inc., in Cincinnati and the body will be made

and the car assembled at the new Crosley plant at Marion, Ind.

Thus the whole great Crosley radio empire turns out to be incidental to the Crosley ambition which is and always has been to produce a pleasing, fast, comfortable car that is both low in cost and inexpensive to operate. The heart of such a car is the light, powerful engine that is now a reality.

According to Mr. Crosley, the automobile will be sold through selected, experienced, franchised dealers in about 150 trading centers in the country and through a number of leading department stores as associate dealers.
